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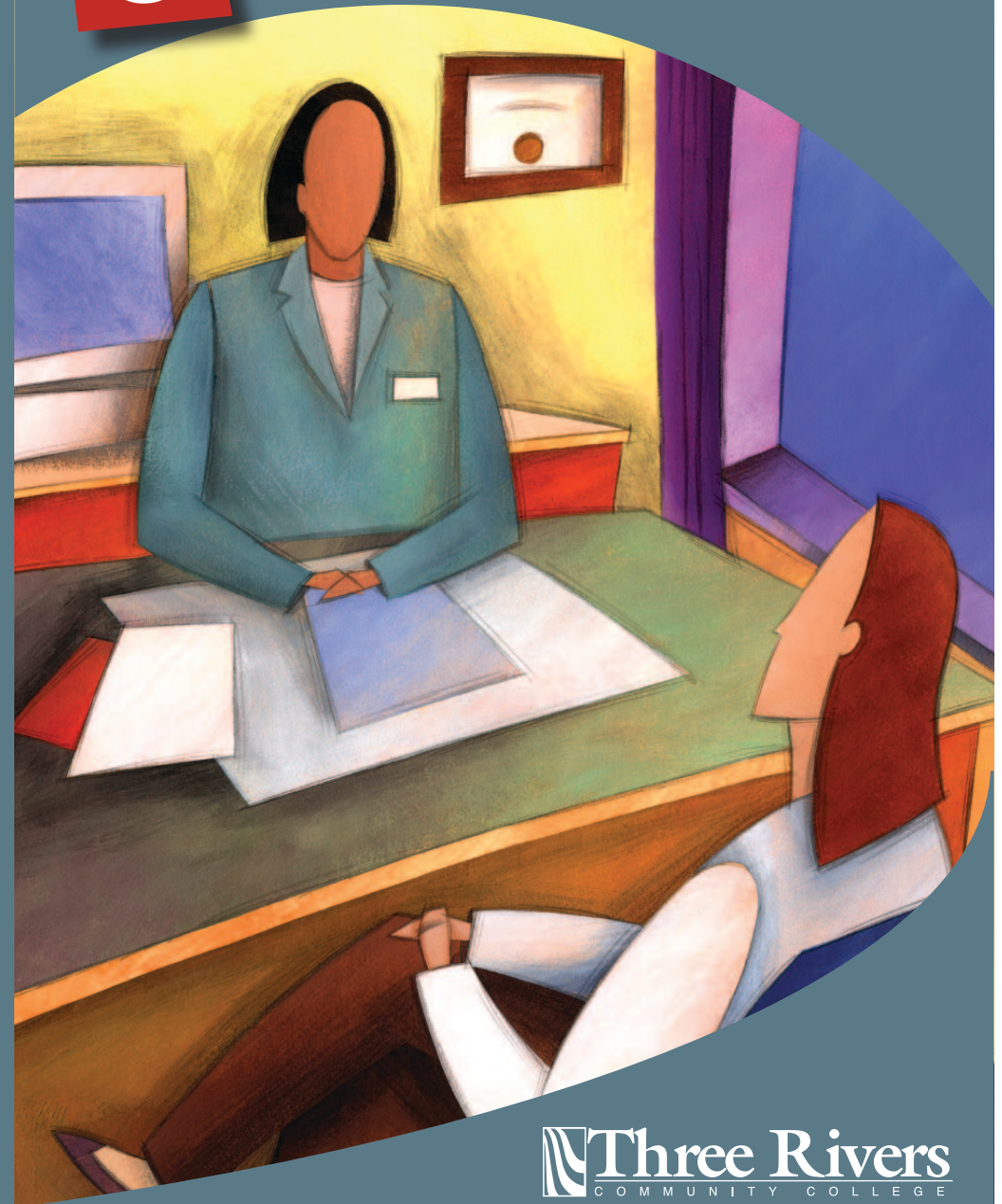

Explore Self

- Update your resume and upload it to College Central
- Explore courses of interest

Explore Careers

- Explore internships and employment related to your interests
- Join a club related to your interests
- Research careers of interest and interview people working in them
- Choose a career and choose a major related to it
- Meet with an advisor in your interest area

Target Careers

- Update your resume and have it reviewed by a counselor
- Get an internship or job in your target career area
- Interview or shadow a professional
- Meet with your advisor to insure you are on track to graduate or transfer
- Identify career options and entry-level requirements

Make the Transition

- Obtain references from faculty and staff
- Network with people in your target career area
- Join organizations related to your target career
- Conduct mock interviews. Have your resume and cover letter reviewed by a professional
- Meet with recruiters and attend career fairs
