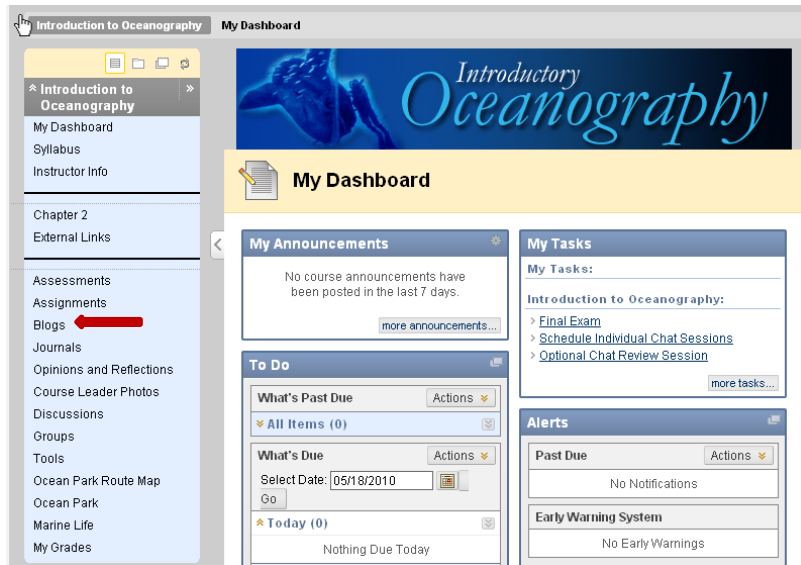


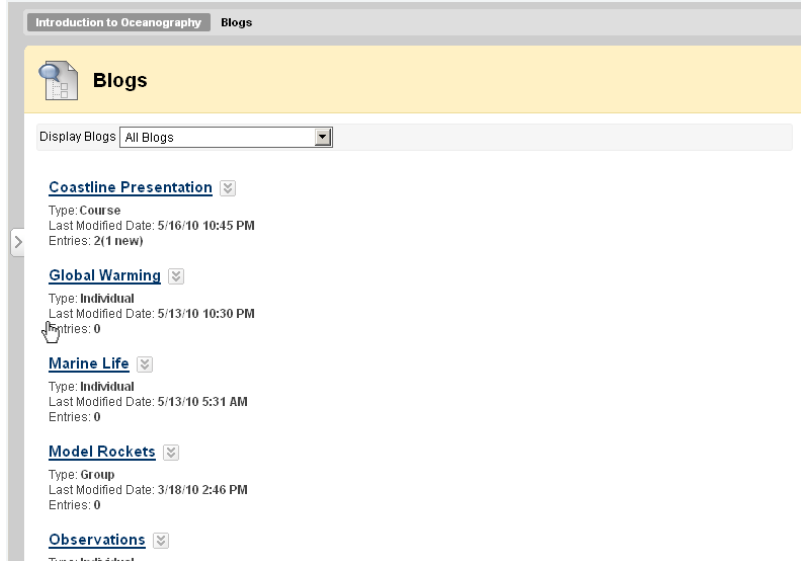
How to create a discussion board post

To post on a discussion board, take the following steps.

1. First click the *Blogs* link. This link may be in different places depending on how your instructor had set up the page.

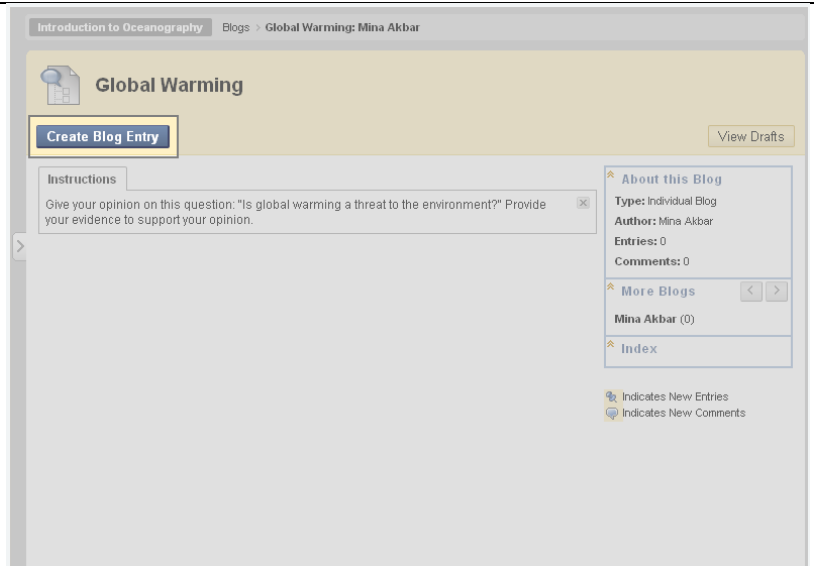


2. Now select the blog you want to post in. The *Course* type allows all enrolled members to post blog entries. The *Individual* type only allows the blog owner to post blog entries. The *Group* type can be seen by all course members, but only members of the group are able to post blog entries. You can see who owns the blog by looking in the blog listings. Be sure to review any criteria for blog posts.

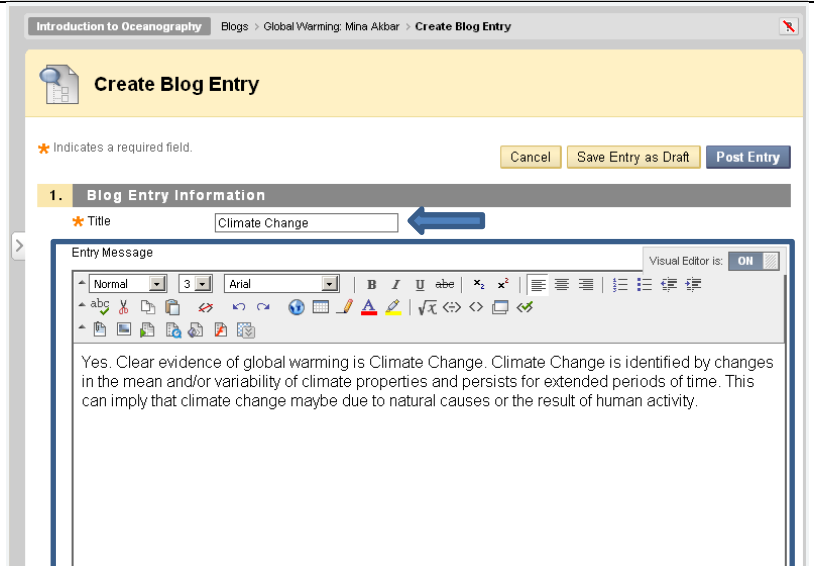


How to create a discussion board post

3. Click the *Create Blog Entry* button.



4. On next page, you are able to enter a title for your post and your message using the text fields provided.



How to create a discussion board post

5. You can attach multiple files to the blog post by using the *Browse My Computer and Browse Content Collection* under the *Blog Entry Files* banner. If you do not want to post just yet and want to come back to it later click the *Save Entry as Draft* at the bottom. Once satisfied, click the *Post Entry* button.
