Students may enroll part-time or full-time, and courses are offered day and evening, weekday and weekend, and online.

Business

The Business Department offers several different programs of study, from Small Business and Entrepreneurial Studies to **Business Administration Management** and Business Information Systems. Whether you are planning to open your own business or seeking a position within the public or private sectors, Three Rivers' faculty members help you achieve your career goals by sharing their diverse professional experience in the classroom. Individuals already employed in business or industry seeking career advancement may also benefit from Three Rivers' business programs as a source of professional development.

Workforce & Community Education

Three Rivers offers an extensive variety of short-term workforce training programs in high demand occupations such as Certified Nurse Aid, Patient Care Technician, Dental Assisting, Pharmacy Technician, EKG Technician Certification, computer skills training, and sustainable studies including Solar Photovoltaic, Solar Thermal and Solar Sales. The programs are taught by industry professionals and designed to fast track students' entry into the workforce.

Engineering Technology

Engineering technology applies principles of math, science, and technology, emphasizing application and practice with a 50/50 mix of theory and laboratory experience. These programs embody a broad range of subjects related to the design, manufacturing, testing, and development of various products, machines, and systems. From a pathway in engineering science to computer science or mechanical engineering technology, Three Rivers offers a comprehensive array of cutting-edge degree and certificate programs in many of today's top technology and engineering fields.

Humanities

Students can enrich their lives and explore the diversity of the human experience by taking humanities classes. Humanities study provides a path for students to reflect upon and question the principles, intentions, and beliefs that govern our lives and actions. Three Rivers' humanities courses help students develop critical thinking and communication skills that allow them to understand and appreciate the experiences of others.

Students interested in pursuing a career in the arts, such as in commercial art, art education and fine arts, or transferring to a 4-year college, will find that Three Rivers' Visual Arts program provides both a strong basic foundation in the visual arts and a broad background in general education.

Mathematics

Often called the universal language, mathematics impacts every one of us on a daily basis. Whether balancing



your checkbook, figuring fuel economy for your car, or unlocking the mysteries of the cosmos, being literate in the language of math helps you achieve success. Three Rivers Community College has a math class designed for your individual skill level from the basics through advanced topics. Our courses provide the foundation for a four-year degree in mathematics, serve as prerequisites for many science and technology courses, and train students in problem solving and logical thinking.

Nursing & Allied Health

Nursing is a dynamic profession that incorporates evidenced-based theory and skills required for safe practice. Nursing practice integrates the art and science of nursing with theoretical principles from the natural, social, behavioral, biological, and physical sciences. Six core values provide the framework for organizing the curriculum: critical thinking, safe and competent practice, caring, professionalism, communication, and holistic care. Program graduates are prepared to assume the multifaceted role of the professional nurse. Graduates possess the ability to recognize and respond to current trends and issues while upholding standards of care through lifelong learning.

Sciences

Science empowers you to make decisions about the world in which you live. Science courses such as biology, chemistry, and physics teach you not only about natural phenomena, but also how to think critically and logically, and how to inquire, observe, and interpret your surroundings. Many science courses incorporate hands-on learning in laboratory settings that enrich the learning experience. Exciting courses such as Human Anatomy and Physiology and Oceanography keep Three Rivers' students engaged both in and out of the classroom.

The Exercise Science program provides a strong foundation in the area of exercise science as well as a broad background in general education. For those students seeking an entrylevel position in health and fitness, the program prepares students for necessary industry certifications and the knowledge and motivation to continue as lifelong learners in health and fitness.

Social Sciences

Since the time of the ancient Greeks, it has been said that a fundamental goal of education is to know thyself, and that the only proper study for humankind is humankind itself. Who are we and how can we understand our behavior? Today, the social sciences seek answers to these very questions. The perspective you gain from an education in social science will help you master the tools of scientific method and critical inquiry, and give you an understanding of human behavior and the social experience from which it emerges. Three Rivers offers programs of study in applied social science fields such as Criminal Justice, Human Services, and Early Childhood Education.

Tutoring and Academic Success Centers (TASC)

Tutoring and Academic Success Centers (TASC) at Three Rivers provide a learner-centered environment that facilitates improved performance and persistence for all students. TASC is designed to assist students with their academic needs across the curriculum. The program features a Tutoring Center, Writing Center, Math Computer Lab, and Language Arts Lab. TASC is staffed by a collaborative team of professionals and peer tutors, all of whom are dedicated to providing academic assistance to students in all subject fields.



Nursing and Allied Health Labs

Our nursing laboratories are equipped with stateof-the-art equipment, such as SimMan patient simulators (portable and advanced patient simulators for team training), that enable students to gain hands-on experience. Students can take vital signs, listen to heart and breath sounds, and perform all of their lab skills on SimMan. Simulated care units allow students to learn and practice skills and to experience high-risk nursing situations in a controlled environment.



The Donald R. Welter Library

The library is a wonderful on-campus resource for students. It houses extensive reference collections, books, scholarly journals, popular magazines, newspapers, DVDs, audiobooks, and reserve collections. Students can also take advantage of Wi-Fi connectivity, computers, group study rooms, the copying facility, and book discussions in the Library Event Room.

The library teaches information literacy skills that provide students with the ability to locate, evaluate and use information to become critical thinkers and lifelong learners.



Art Gallery

The Art Gallery is a contemporary visual art space with rotating exhibits featuring works of emerging and established artists, both local and national. Students and community members are invited to gallery receptions and artist talks with each new exhibition. A Student Art Show is hosted annually in May. Through relevant exhibitions with diverse perspectives and related educational programming the gallery is dedicated to providing cultural enrichment to the college and the surrounding community.

Cafeteria and Cyber Café

The cafeteria is a bright open space that serves freshly prepared hot and cold meals throughout the week. Students can also purchase beverages, salads and snacks. The cafeteria is the site of many events on campus such as career and volunteer fairs, cultural expos, poetry slams, and impromptu study sessions. For a more casual atmosphere, students can stop in to the cyber café for coffee, cookies, and more.





The Health and Wellness Center

Enrolled students have free access to use the Three Rivers Health and Wellness Center. The center has a wide array of cardio machines such as treadmills, elliptical trainers and stationary bikes, resistance training machines, a weight room, and an exercise room. The center also has locker rooms and showers.



Student Activities and Game Room

The Student Activities and Game Room is a great place to relax or to meet friends for a game of pool—or Wii—in between classes. Students can check out Wii remotes and games, or billiard balls and cues from the Student Programs Office with a valid photo ID. The Student Lounge, a free space for all students to use, is open during normal building hours.

Transfer Options

at TRCC

Options that are there for you when you are ready to move on.

Three Rivers Community College offers many opportunities to transfer for completion of Bachelor's level programs and degrees should students so choose. These options include guaranteed admission programs and degree pathway agreements with many public and private colleges and universities in Connecticut.

The transfer options provide our students with the benefit of a smooth transition from their program of study at TRCC to their intended program of study at their transfer institution of choice. This smooth transition has been accomplished by the care taken to design and have in place formal contracts and agreements between Three Rivers and other institutions offering relevant Bachelor's degree programs for our students.

With the guidance of their academic advisor, Three Rivers students, as early as their first semester, may begin to explore and apply to the transfer programs available in their area of interest or intended career path.

Programs and agreements are available between Three Rivers and many excellent colleges and universities within Connecticut. Enrolling at Three Rivers and taking advantage of our transfer opportunities can help you achieve your educational goals while saving you thousands of tuition dollars.

Prior to earning 15 credits at Three Rivers, students interested in transfer options must complete a special

application enrolling them in the guaranteed admission program or degree pathway track at the college of their intended transfer.

Each transfer option program requires a minimum G.P.A. (grade point average) in order to be eligible to apply and to maintain eligibility to transfer. Minimum G.P.A.s vary depending on the transfer option.

Each transfer option program has a time limit for completing the associate's degree. Time limits depend on the transfer option and range from no time limit to four or five years for associate's degree completion.
