## Job Outlook/ Opportunities

Wildlife rehabilitators care for injured or abandoned wild animals, particularly where human-wildlife interactions are common. They don't need formal education but can seek certification, such as that offered by the wildlife Rehabilitation Council. Some states require wildlife rehabilitators to hold a permit to practice.
