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GUIDELINES AND REQUIREMENTS FOR ENG 102 LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION

Attendance: Writing and Literature courses require you to participate in class discussion and critique as a way of being exposed to important concepts and ideas concerning the works we will be examining, not to mention as a way of exploring your own thoughts on particular works. Therefore, attendance is crucial. Late arrivals to class will not be tolerated and, if habitual, will be considered absences. Paper Format: All formal essays (a total of three) should be generated on computer or word processor -- this is required. Essays should be double-spaced, with margins no greater than 1.5 inches and fonts no larger than 12-point. All essays that require research must follow MLA citation format, guidelines for which can be found in The Writer's Reference, at the Writing Center, and in other books as well. Last minute corrections on final copies, due to close proof reading, may be made neatly in black ink.
