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Course description

This 200-level course will study the physical, psychosocial and cognitive development of humans from birth to death. There will be an emphasis on distinct time periods such as conception and development of the fetus, infancy, childhood, puberty and adolescence, young, middle, and late adulthood, and gerontology. We will focus on **healthy** development of the human within each time period, though will discuss environmental, behavioral and genetic factors which effect healthy development.

Learning objectives

The course investigates the numerous facets of growth which contribute to an integrated, whole person. In addition, we will consider the developmental challenges faced by individuals moving toward maturity and through adulthood. You will learn the manner in which physical, cognitive and social factors interact to affect growth. It is expected that you will integrate your personal experiences with course materials to enrich your understanding of health. The course requires thoughtful understanding of the material presented and interaction amongst your classmates as we discuss varying viewpoints.

Class time will be used in combinations of didactic lecture, small group work, film clips and experiential moments. Participation and attendance is expected as it enriches your experience and enhances understanding of the material.

Journals

During this class, you'll consider major components of the conception and development of a human life. Questions posed in class will direct the entry you are to bring to your next class. For instance, you may need to write about attachment theory. This journal is a way to consider life stages as we take this person from conception to death. We'll use this journal for class discussion which means **take your journal to each class**. You will be responsible for reading assigned materials **and** answering journal questions before each class. We'll do peer review and discussion each class and be prepared to hand them in upon request. This is 25% of your class grade. There will be **no credit** given for late journal entries as the point is to inform your class discussion **not** be a summation of our class discussion.

Birthing paper

Please view two births (there are many to choose from on YouTube) and write a paper comparing the benefits and drawbacks as well as physical, emotional and literal costs of each type of birth. Indicate which type of birth you would choose for yourself or your partner and include why.

Research paper: You are required to choose and get approval on a topic that discusses a stage or issue in life development. Keep in mind, we are studying healthy development. You may find, however, that you are interested in a topic that negatively effects healthy development. I will be happy to discuss this choice with you for suitability to our class. I will break this down into steps each of which will contribute to your research paper grade. You are required to provide an outline of this research paper for review. Please make sure you use valid, scholarly sources to inform your research paper. Explore our library; there are many journals available to help you pick a topic for review. This is not a Google assignment. Your report should be at least 7 pages in length (not including title, abstract, or reference pages.) You should use APA formatting which requires a title page, abstract, body and reference page (not included in the 7 page count.) The report should be double-spaced using Times New Roman 12. Please don't quadruple space between paragraphs. \odot
