Course Description:

This course provides, in a non-technical presentation, a basic understanding of personal finance. The choices that consumers face in managing their finances are examined. The topics include: personal income and budgeting, consumer credit, investing, taxes, housing, insurance, retirement, and estate planning.

Students will learn personal finance basics including the time value of money, money management skills, tax planning, savings and payment skills, consumer credit and purchasing strategies, selecting and financing housing, insurance coverage (home, auto, health, disability, life), investing basics including bonds, stocks and mutual funds, and retirement and estate planning.
