Wednesday – Fall 2008
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Prerequisite:

Successful completion of ACC 111 with a "C" grade or better.

Course Description:

A continuation of the study of accounting theory and practice, that includes an introduction to partnerships, corporations, and the analysis of financial statements. The course consists of four lecture hours.

Instructional Methodology:

The primary method of instruction will be classroom lecture and problem solving.

Educational Objectives:

To introduce you to the basic accounting principles and concepts, the accounting cycle, and financial statements.
