Practicum in Human Services

Course Description:

This course is a practicum/field work experience in human services which is defined as direct involvement in a non-classroom setting sponsored by the College and jointly supervised by the agency and faculty. Students must have completed a minimum of 30 credits with 12 credits in human services degree courses.

Required Text:

The Social Work Interview A Guide for Human Services Professionals. Alfred and Goldie Kadushin, 1997 (4th Edition).

Learning Outcomes

- . Engagement of students in group discussions to enhance their direct practice experiences;
- . To provide evidence-based learning opportunities through a range of direct practice experiences that include opportunities to work with clients in a community-based, agency setting;
- . To provide learning opportunities for students to have a better understanding of specific population groups and how they are affected by specific social problems or issues;
- . To provide learning opportunities for each student to complete a field work experience in a direct practice setting under the supervision of a professional agency staffer.

Assignments:

1. A typed, 5-6 page paper on the history, mission, programs and services of the organization, population(s) served, funding, etc. Represents 25 percent of final grade.

Due: Last Week in February.

2. A typed, 5-6 page paper detailing student's field work experience at the agency. Represents 25 percent of final grade.

Due: First Week in May.

3. Completion of 90 hours of field work at designated agency. To be completed by last class date in May. Represents 50 percent of final grade.
