The textbook is Elementary and Intermediate Algebra, By Baratto, Bergman, and Hutchison. It can be purchased as an electronic text with the software.

Credits: 4 credit hours

**Course Description**: This course represents the Intermediate Algebra Instruction with embedded developmental support. The course cultivates understanding and different representations of functions. The course covers linear, quadratic, exponential, rational, and radical functions, equations and expressions and operations on them with emphasis on modeling and real world problems.

**Grading Policy**: A student will receive one of the following grades: A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D+, D, D-, F, W, P, or Audit. Your grade will be determined in the following manner:

- 1. Tests. There will be 5 tests given throughout the semester. The tests will be worth 40 percent of the final grade. There will be no make up test without a doctor's note. The lowest test score will be dropped if all five are taken.
- 2. Homework. Homework will be assigned at each class meeting throughout the semester and will be worth 15 percent of the final grade. All work must be shown. A list of answers is unacceptable. The homework should be kept in a notebook or an organized folder. Homework assignments are due no later than the corresponding test date.
- 3. Final Exam. A comprehensive Final Exam will be given during the last class meeting. The exam will be worth 30 percent of the final grade.

4. Lab Participation. Students are required to use the ALEKS software for a minimum of three hours a week. A tutor and I will be available during Wednesday evening Lab to assist. The on-line participation will be worth 15 percent of the final grade.
