Course Title: Managerial Accounting

Course Number: Accounting 118

Credits: Four Semester Hours

Prerequisite: Accounting 112

Course Description:

A study of the application of accounting principles and procedures to the cost control function of manufacturing business management. Emphasis is placed on managerial analysis and control, job order costing, process costs, standard costs, and variance analysis.

General Course Goals:

- 1. To make the student aware of the numerous opportunities for exercising professional judgment, not just the mechanical application of a formula or format.
- 2. To learn specific managerial accounting treatments for enterprise activity.
- To enable students to provide reliable information about an enterprise's production activity.
- 4. To get the student to think like a managerial accountant.

Course Materials Required:

Garrison and Noreen, Managerial Accounting, 11th Edition.

Attendance Policy:

Second Examination: Chapters 5, 6 and 7

Third Examination: Chapters 9, 10 and 13

Students who miss any one exam or who score lower than they would like can take the otherwise optional, cumulative final examination, which will substitute for that one test.
