Course Description:

Fundamental principles of management and business operations are discussed with emphasis placed on management orientation, policy making, practical problem analysis, and philosophy. Attention will also center on the following management functions: planning, organizing, leading, and controlling.

Rational:

The manager's primary responsibility is to achieve the goals of the organization. This requires skills in decision-making and a mastery of the planning, implementation, and control process. Managers must accomplish organizational goals through people. Therefore, managers need knowledge of and skills in motivation, communication, staffing, organizing, and leadership. The intent of this course is to cover the basic concepts in management and to apply these concepts to practical situations.

Objectives:

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- Elements of management that are basic to the successful operation of a variety of organizations;
- Principles of leadership, communication, decision-making, motivation, planning, problem- solving, and organizational structure.

- Attitudes, skills, and tools of management;
