Course Description: This course focuses on basic arithmetic and pre-algebra skills. Topics include: whole numbers, fractions, decimal numbers, proportions, ratios, percents, perimeter, area, volume, applications, signed numbers, algebraic expressions and equations. (Course does not satisfy the minimum requirements for graduation.) You must receive a C or better in Math 075 to continue on to Math 095.

Course Objectives: To provide students with an understanding of mathematical skills and prepare the student for basic algebra.

Transferability: This course does not transfer, as math credit, to most colleges.
