COURSE DESCRIPTION

3 Semester hours

Study of the principles of economics designed to introduce the student to the basic concepts of the economic system. Emphasis will be on the economic thought process. Discussion of money and banking, national income, fiscal measures and stabilizing the economy are all included.

GRADING POLICY

There will be two (2) TESTS and two (2) EXAMS during the semester. TESTs will account for 30% of your semester grade and the Exams will account for 60%.

In addition to the testing, attendance, class participation and a research paper will account for 10 % of you're your final semester grade.

Homework assignments addressing various chapters will also be assigned. These assignments are geared to assist in understanding important concepts and may be similar to test material. A research paper will also be assigned which will complement semester topics thus providing students with insight to 'real life' economic issues.

It is strongly suggested that students read financial periodicals (i.e., the <u>Wall Street Journal</u>) on a regular basis throughout the semester. Class participation points may be given to students who regularly discuss current articles from these sources.
