COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This composition course is an introductory writing course focusing on expository writing and research. Weekly writing assignments, analyses of reading assignments, class discussions and formal papers are designed to improve writing skills. This course includes in-class activities designed to increase self-confidence and nurture confidence in writing.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

To prepare students to write effective college-level essays

To gain proficiency in analyzing and interpreting ideas from readings

To gain grammatical proficiency including spelling and punctuation

To demonstrate clarity, specificity and organization in writing

To analyze the strengths and weaknesses of one's own and others' writing

To learn and apply MLA standards for papers including citation format

To increase vocabulary

Three 5-Page typed essays are designed to give you opportunities to demonstrate your proficiency in analyzing and interpreting ideas from our readings in the context of your own opinions about the issues presented. Writing is a process requiring editing and rewriting. Feel free to bring your initials drafts to The Writing Center, if you want help with your papers. Each essay should be typed, double-spaced with one-inch margins, proofread and passed in no later than the due date. Early papers are welcome. Late papers will be penalized. I do not accept emailed papers, hard copies only. Please follow the MLA Guide For Writers of Research Papers for documentation formats.

Note: Plagiarism is unacceptable. To plagiarize is "to steal and pass off [the ideas or words of another] as one's own" (Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary). Plagiarizing is a serious violation of academic standards and can result in a failing grade for the paper, and even a failing grade for the course. Familiarize yourself with **TRCC Academic Honesty Policy.**

Three In-Class Essays give students the opportunity to demonstrate clarity, specificity and organization with their writing. These in-class essays will also reveal the student's increased understanding of grammatical proficiency including spelling and appropriate punctuation without electronic aids. You are welcome to bring dictionaries and thesauruses for these tests.
