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COURSE OUTLINE

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course presents the basic principles, current research and traditional theories of child development, from the prenatal period to the onset of adolescence, with an emphasis on the earlier years of childhood. Students will be guided in the development of a scientific and objective attitude toward the interpretation of child behavior and will study various methods of conducting research in child development. You will observe children and analyze their behavior in each of the following areas: physical abilities and motor skills, cognitive abilities as well as social and emotional development.

Class time will be filled with a combination of didactic lecture, instruction and discussion led by fellow classmates, internet exploration, film and small group work. Please come to class prepared by having read the material assigned for that class period. You will be expected to utilize the online learning center: http://www.mhhe.com/santrocked13.

OBSERVATION PAPERS: There are two assigned observations of children that will be due on October 30th and on December 11th. You are asked to observe and interact if appropriate, with children representing two separate age groups. For instance, you might choose an infant of 6 months for the first paper and a child of 3 years for the second paper. You are to note the child's ability in the following areas: social interaction, physical capabilities, motor skills and cognitive abilities. If you don't complete the assignment by the due date, you'll lose 10 points for each **day** it is late. You will need to present an observation paper in class. Please see me early in the semester to choose your date but, at the latest, by October 11th.
