A New Change For The Whaling City

State Pier and Crystal Avenue are Under Construction to Modernize

The city of New London is now starting to experience modernization. One of the many new projects to further improve the city is the newly constructed apartment complexes on Bank Street. Crystal Avenue and State Pier are the next victims for reconstruction.

The plans for the Pier have been going on since early 2021. The State Department and Energy and

Environmental Protection (DEEP) had approved the Connecticut Port Authority to fill in about seven cubic acres in between the 2 piers. The end result of this project is to have State Pier become a hub for offshore wind power and other marine innovations along the East coast.

Not everyone is in agreement with this plan. Organizations like DRVN Enterprises tried


to stop the permit from being approved but unfortunately failed.

Construction is set to be completed by the end of 2022. The project leaders say that the enhancement of the port will create 400 construction jobs and 100 permanent jobs. This project cost about \$235.5 million.

Another project underway is the demolition of the Thames River Apartments on Crystal Avenue. According to the city, the court agreed in 2014 that the residents were living in sub-standard housing. The apartments have been closed down since 2018, and the tenets had been given vouchers and were relocated.

Mayor Passero said that the state had provided \$3.7 million to help the demolition of the apartments and the city provided an extra \$700,000. The first phase of the demolition consisted of addressing environmental concerns.

The demolition began on February 9th. The mayor believes that the clean-up should be completed around May. "It's been rezoned for commercial industrial and we expect it to find a good reuse in that sector," said Passero.

Efrain Dominguez Jr., who is the city's council president, who grew up in these apartments, agreed with Passero. "Something commercial, something industrial that we can add to the grand list to bring revenue into our city and help people affected by this," said Dominguez.

n February the 23rd, Asnuntuck Community College in association with their student government, presented their fourth and final live discussion for the month of February under the topic of Black History Month.

A new sub-variant of the Covid-19 Omicron variant appears

Just when we thought it couldn't get any worse, another member of the COVID-19 variant family comes to say hello.

The Omicron variant, also known as BA.1 has been seen to have a sub-variant: BA.2. This sub-variant has been seen to be able to spread quicker than its sibling and is said to become the dominant version of COVID-19.

According to CNBC, "It's now the top variant in at least 18 countries and rapidly spreading, representing 35% of all new cases that have been genetically sequenced worldwide, up from 10 countries and 21% of cases the week before, according to new data from the World Health Organization."

Though it sounds scary, will this version bring more severe and dangerous infection and bring more people to the hospital? Though the research is not conclusive, it is said that BA.2 is shown to have the same symptoms as BA.1.

The sub-variant, while not being more severe, can still reinfect people who have caught the Omicron variant before, but it seems rare for it to happen.

The COVID-19 virus is still dangerous and many should be aware of the new versions that may appear whether more dangerous or not.

Remembering Ahmaud Arbery


ebruary 23, 2022, marks 2 years after the murder of Ahmaud Arbery, a young 25-year-old black man who was gunned down by men claiming to be conducting a citizen's arrest during a jog in Georgia.

On February 22, Arbery's killers, Travis McMichael, Gregory McMichael and William "Roddie" Bryan were found guilty on all counts in a federal hate crime trial. Prosecutors won the case that the three men chased Arbery through the streets because he was black. They are already serving life sentences for his murder.

The loss of Arbery was felt around the world with Black Lives Matter protests popping up in his name.


There has been a lot of change since his death two years ago. Months after the shooting the governor of Georgia, Brian Kemp, signed a hate crime bill into law that allows judges to "increase punishment against those who target victims based on perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender, mental disability or physical disability."

Reflecting on The Change Since His Passing

In addition to this Kemp introduced a revision to the state's citizen arrest law in response to Arbery's murder. According to CNN, "The new law requires that a person attempting to carry out a citizen's arrest must call authorities



within an hour or release the detained offender. If law enforcement does not arrive within the hour, the detainee must be released."

Wanda Cooper-Jones, Arbery's mother founded the Ahmaud Arbery Foundation in his honor. The foundation aims to support the mental wellness of Black boys who lack access to mental health resources. The foundation rewards six \$3,000 scholarships to seniors from the high school where Arbery graduated from.

"Justice goes beyond judgment made in a courtroom," Cooper-Jones told CNN. "Justice ensures every child, no matter of his skin color, his socioeconomic situation, is safe and has equal opportunities to realize their dreams."

Meaningless War and the Devastation of Ukrainian Lives

There is no doubt what is happening in Ukraine at the moment by the hands of Putin and the Russian army is nothing more than heartbreakingly devastating, and with every passing day the stories continue to pile up as the countless citizens fall victim of this meaningless war.

As of Monday, February 28th, it is reported that at least 102 civilians in Ukraine have been killed since Russia launched its invasion. A further 304 are injured, but the real figure is feared to be "considerably higher," U.N. human rights chief Michelle Bachelet said.

Currently in Ukraine there is a ban on men from the ages of 18 to 60 from passing and leaving the border, in the need to fight. In response to this ban, a 38 year old man and his two younger children were trying to get out of Ukraine to meet his wife, the kids moms, coming from Italy.

The ban on the Ukrainian border left the father at a standstill with his two kids until Nataliya Ableyeva, a Ukrainian women crossing the border, saw the desperate father and his two children.

"Their father simply handed over the two kids to me, and trusted me, giving me their passports to bring them over," Ableyeva said.

The father saying goodbye as they crossed the border into the Hungarian side at Beregsurany, waited for their mother.
Anna Semyuk, the mother, arrived quickly embracing the children.

"All I can say to my kids now, is that everything will be alright," said Semyuk. Thanks to Ableyeva, the children were brought to the safety of their mothers arms.

Resolving Polluted Stormwater Runoff by MS4s

An Environmental Issue Seminar Presented by Bob Russo

This semester, Three Rivers Community
College offers free seminars related to
environmental issues. The topic for the class
on February 23 regarded an issue
that many are not aware of; polluted
stormwater runoff into local water bodies.

Bob Russo, who works for CLA Engineers as a soil scientist, gave the presentation to a roomful of students and members of the community who were interested in the subject. Before the seminar began, Russo encouraged everyone to ask questions at any point during the presentation.

Russo's presentation involved a PowerPoint slideshow, which highlighted the different aspects of polluted stormwater runoff. He spoke about municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s), which are the primary transport for polluted stormwater runoff.

MS4s are designed or used to collect stormwater. Storm drains and pipes are commonly known as MS4s. When the polluted stormwater runs through these MS4s, it is often discharged, untreated, into local water bodies. Russo provided information about the six minimum control measures a public entity should have in place in regards to MS4s:

Public education
 Utilizing websites, mailings, and science
 classes for outreach to keep the public aware
 of these issues

- Public involvement
 Providing opportunities for the public to participate in program development and implementation, including effectively publicizing public hearings and/or encouraging citizen representatives on a storm water management panel
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)

Implementing a plan to detect and eliminate illicit discharges to the storm sewer system

Construction

Developing, implementing, and enforcing an erosion and sediment control program for construction activities that disturb one or more acres of land

Post-construction

Developing, implementing, and enforcing a program to address discharges of post-construction stormwater runoff from new development and redevelopment areas.

Pollution prevention

Developing and implementing a program with the goal of preventing or reducing pollutant runoff from municipal operations. The program must include municipal staff training on pollution prevention measures and techniques.

I attended the seminar virtually, and it was well done in my opinion. Russo did a great job in his preparation for the seminar, giving his audience an insightful perspective on an issue that some of us may have not known about

There were also helpful discussions between Russo and his audience, with an additional half hour at the end of the seminar specifically for questions.

If you would like to educate yourself about environmental issues in our community,
I strongly encourage you to attend one of these seminars.

The college has them available every Wednesday at 6pm through May 11, and you can join in-person or virtually.



Being Honest About AST K101


stronomy is a subject that I've always wanted to learn about, studying the stars and our solar system was always intriguing to me. For reference, the course that I took was AST K101, Principles of Astronomy. It was a 12-week course that was all online.

This course teaches students the basics of Astronomy, such as time zones, the temperatures and brightness of stars/H-R diagram, and moons motion/phases. I had some basic knowledge on these subjects; however, the course goes more in depth and gives a good amount of information. Throughout the course, learning about all the different subjects really gave me a sense of what Astronomy really is.

The textbook that is required is titled, Astronomy: A self-teaching guide. 8th edition by Moche, Dinah L. And a tool that isn't required, but is a Miller Planisphere. A planisphere shows you what the view overhead will look like on any night throughout a year.



CSCU Board Increases College Tuition

An inevitable outcome due to the pandemic

Tuition will be on the rise at the state's 12 community colleges as the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities (CSCU) system governing board, voted to increase tuition for the upcoming academic year.

Tuition and mandatory fees at the state's community colleges are currently \$4,476 but will increase to \$4,700 for full-time students for the 2022-23 academic year.

CSCU leaders say the decision to raise tuition at the colleges is due to factors including increasing labor costs, the system running out of federal funds, and colleges continuing to see a drop in enrollment due to the pandemic.


Ben Barnes, CSCU chief financial officer, explained that before the pandemic, the system's finances were already substantially depleted. But since the pandemic, he said, revenue has dropped across the system by over \$80 million a year.

"We estimate, between this year's shortfall and next year, we have a deficit of about \$270 million. The Governor's proposal would have provided close to \$100 million of that. We've asked the appropriations committee to give us \$175 million in additional aid to get us through '23. So, we're in deep trouble," Barnes said.

For the last three years, tuition at community colleges has remained for the most part consistent. But Barnes said that while it was a difficult decision to make, one of the reasons they thought increasing tuition now was reasonable is because of the implementation of resources like the PACT program.

In Connecticut, PACT funding covers the gap between federal and state grants you receive, and community college tuition and mandatory fees for eligible high school graduates who enroll at any community college in the state full-time.

This is about 25% of the CSCU population, Barnes added.

During Thursday's February 24 board meeting, students, faculty, and a few board members raised concerns about the tuition increase, saying that since a large number of the students at the community colleges come from low-income or working-class families, this decision could bring on significant financial stress for many students within the CSCU student population.

"I've spoken to many fellow students about this proposal to increase tuition. This increase will prohibit them to continue their college education due to the financial disadvantages it will pose," Jamie Czikowsky, a student at Tunxis Community College, said during the meeting. "Students [then] will have to choose between paying for their education, or putting food on the table, paying for childcare, or other basic needs that the extra \$224 had provided them ... From my conversations with students, these hikes will directly result in more enrollment decline."


Richard Balducci, chairman of the Board of Regents finance committee, said most students still aren't going to see any out-of-pocket costs even with the \$224 increase, because 71% of the students who apply for financial aid at the colleges pay close to nothing for tuition and fees because of grants including PACT, Pell, Roberta Willis, or a combination.

As a student that receives financial aid myself, I do not feel the \$224 increase will affect me as I mercifully fall within the 71% cited above.

However, I cannot speak for the single mothers who must struggle while trying to balance a full-time job, and choose between paying for their education, or putting food on the table as Czikowsky stated.

There is a fine line, and CSCU board members must continue to have these conversations in order to properly allocate funds to those that need it most.





Texas Chainsaw Massacre (2022)

Can Netflix Continue the Saga?

n Friday February 18th, Netflix alongside with Legendary Pictures,
Bad Hombre, and Exurbia Films released their highly anticipated horror film,

Texas Chainsaw Massacre. For context, the film is based on the original movie,

The Texas Chainsaw Massacre from 1974.

In the original, Sally and her friends go to see her grandfather's grave, but they stop to pick up a hitchhiker. However, something goes wrong, and the hitchhiker is dead. The group needs to figure out what to do with the body when they stumble upon an old farmhouse. That's when the group meets Leatherface and his estranged cannibal family.

The group then fights for their life to escape.

The new *Texas Chainsaw Massacre* is set in 2022, 50 years after the tragic events of the first couple of movies. In the beginning, the viewer meets Melody and Dante, two entrepreneurs, Lila who is Melody's sister, and Ruth who is Dante's girlfriend. The group is traveling to Harlow, a small ghost town in Texas to auction off property to make the town a trendy place for people to get away from their regular life.

However, there's trouble when a mother and her adopted son are still living in the ghost town. After a fight between Dante and the mother, she has a heart attack and is rushed to the hospital. From there the infamous killer, Leatherface is triggered again to murder anyone in the small town of Harlow.

In the beginning of *Texas Chainsaw Massacre*, I was excited, as someone who loved the first couple movies, I felt that Netflix would give the franchise a breath of fresh air. The characters were decent, the plot doesn't stray away from the previous movies, and to a point there was a good amount of overlap plot wise.

As the film continued, I started to feel that the breath of fresh air I wanted, gave the movie too much of a new feeling. Meaning, one or two of the jokes were cringey and felt forced due to the era the film is set in, and the story progression was a little fast compared to the other movies.

Towards the end of film, I was pleasantly surprised with the use of classic horror suspense, that made some of the final scenes very entertaining and left me wondering what is going to happen next. This is exercised in one of the last scenes, the feeling that the movie is wrapping up and then there is a sudden thrill which led my imagination to see what will happen in the next movie if there is one.

I was decently pleased how the film came out, it wasn't perfect, but would you expect any movie to be after countless continuations and remakes? Kanye made the move in frustration with the pay artists get from streaming.





HyperX Cloud Flight Wireless

hether you're a hardcore PC gamer like me or a console peasant much like yourself, eventually the people you live with get annoyed at the various diegetic sounds coming from your video games. Maybe you've already got a great pair of headphones and a spotty webcam with a terrible mic to cover your multiplayer needs but sometimes it's nice to have it all in one place. That's where a gaming headset comes in.

When it comes to gaming peripherals, a quality headset is arguably one of the most important purchases a gamer can make. And believe me, I have had my ears tucked between quite a few of them in my 36 years of polishing a sword that will never be used in the real world.

There are many reasons you may choose one headset over another. Such as comfort, noise isolation, build quality, wired or wireless functionality, and of course, price.

If you're an audiophile and you're interested in better sound staging and other intricate



aspects that could make a difference in hearing the slightest foot shuffle or picking out the softest musical chord, a gaming headset is not for you.

However, if you're looking for a quality wireless gaming headset at a reasonable price point, the HyperX Cloud Flight Wireless is an excellent place to start.

The Cloud Flight Wireless sports a mostly plastic build, with a stainless-steel strip running through the headband. It connects to the platform of your choice using a USB-A dongle. There's also a 3.5mm port, so you can connect it to something with a headphone jack too.

The memory foam cushions are covered in a soft leatherette like material, and the ear pads are both wide and deep enough to accommodate a variety of ear shapes and sizes. They fit my head quite well with just the right amount of pressure to keep them in place.



Regarding functionality, using the headset is quite simple. There are two on-ear control features aside from the power button, a volume dial at the back edge of the right ear cup, and the side panel on the left ear cup to mute the detachable microphone.

HyperX has been killing the wired headset market in the last year or so. All that they seem to have been missing was a suitable wireless option that could compete with companies like Logitech, Corsair or Razer in terms of comfort and affordability – the quality has always been top tier.

Due to a great combination of sound, build quality, comfort, and at a price point of \$119.99, I would rate the Cloud Flight Wireless a solid 8 out of 10.

Gaming with the Cloud Flight Wireless is a seamless,

straightforward experience. The headset is comfortable enough for long gaming sessions and it has more than enough battery life to fit a couple hours in before charging. What the Cloud Flight Wireless does, it does well

AT&T is Ending Their 3G Service

Is this the end of 3G?

3G has been around since 2001 and has given millions of people the ability to call or text anyone and use the internet anywhere in the world. However, in the last 15 years 4G and 5G have taken over and has become the new standard for cell service. Due to that, AT&T has issued a statement that they are no longer supporting 3G services in 2022.

On February 22, the company issued a statement that explained why they are no longer supporting 3G, and how their customers can continue to have cellular service. AT&T explained saying, "to bring you faster speeds and new features, we're excited to upgrade America's best network."

AT&T didn't explain further why it was necessary to shut down their 3G network, but this is an exciting moment for their customers. New and faster network speeds mean there are more possibilities for their cellular service.

Within the same statement, AT&T lists steps for how customers can check to see if their current phone is compatible with the new network. "It's important to check the model numbers next to your device to make sure it's still supported since the 3G network shutdown. Once you know your device still works, you may need to restart your device or check the VoLTE or LTE status."

AT&T also has a link to a PDF listing all the devices that are still compatible. For the most part, if a customer has a device that is from 2016 or newer, they are in the clear.

AT&T also has options for customers that are currently under the 3G service, they include upgrading your phone online or in store, or swapping to a compatible device.

AT&T is making big moves this year and shutting down their 3G service is a big step that could impact many customers who have an older phone. But AT&T has answers for customers who are afraid of losing service.

- Laptops unable to boot (fixed with 12.0.1 update)
- Inability to charge sleeping laptops with
- MagSafe. (fixed with 12.1)
- Battery draining issues (fixed with 12.1)

Moving on from the negative side, let's get into the features users have enjoyed from macOS Monterey. Some of the key features and enhancements include:

SharePlay over FaceTime:

- Watch movies and shows, listen to music together with your friends
- Share your screen
- Synced playback
- Shared music queue

Shortcuts:

- Find new prebuilt, customizable shortcuts, made iust for Mac
- Shortcuts automatically sync across all Apple devices

- Content sent over Messages automatically appears in a new Shared with You section in the corresponding app
- Photos sent over Messages automatically appear in
- Alongside shared content in the corresponding apps, you can see who sent it and open the associated conversation in Messages

Focus:

- Create a custom Focus to filter notifications based on what you're currently doing
- Set allowed interruptions so that the most important notifications from people or apps will get through to you while focusing
- When using a Focus on one device, it's automatically set on other devices
