Don't forget to go to the many light shows that are found in rural areas displaying the beauty of the holidays in a full bright manner.


Some may consider taking their interests to winterthemed concerts, that when performed during a snow fall, can bring a massive amount of holiday joy out of oneself.



Five Nights at Freddy's Another failed video game adaptation

live Nights at Freddy's is a family-friendly horror film, about a security guard who must face off against horrific robot animals. Based off the 2014 video game series, the film attempts to capture the essence of the games in a way that pleases both casual viewers and longtime fans of the series. The film stars Josh Hutcherson, Lail, and Piper Rubio, and is written by series creator Scott Cawthon, director Emma Tammi, and Scott Cuddeback.

Over the years many video game companies have tried and failed to successfully adapt their franchise to the big screen. *Five Nights at Freddy's* fights an uphill battle, having the film release years past their peak of popularity. Many fans are left asking, "Why now?"

The storyline of the game series is extremely open and vague, leaving a lot of room for exploration in a feature length film. The movie does a luke-warm job at expanding the world of Freddy Fazbear's Pizzeria. Rather than exploring the intriguing concept of a haunted pizza restaurant from the 80s, the film insists on developing generic characters, and a convoluted plotline that leaves more questions than answers.

The film's inconsistent tone is *Five Nights at Freddy's* biggest weakness. The movie can't decide whether it is a thrilling horror movie, a heartfelt character drama, or a shallow parody of the series. The attempt to please all audiences result in a forgettable movie that pleases no one.



The Marvels

A generic, predictable action film

arvel Studio's latest installment is a lighthearted, vibrant action movie with little consequence. *The Marvels* continues the extensive anthology of the Marvel Cinematic Universe in a way that appeals to both new and old fans alike. Directed by Nia DaCosta, the story follows up 2019's *Captain Marvel* in a way that caters to all viewers.

Starring Brie Larson, Teyonah Parris, and Iman Vellani, the ensemble cast crack jokes while facing off against another generic sci-fi villain. Although the cast's chemistry is on point, their scenes together are tainted by poorly written, cheesy dialogue. On top of that, the film's hollow villain and forgettable story dimmish the quality of the movie as a whole.

Overall the film fails to add anything new to the Marvel Cinematic Universe. If you've seen any of the previous films, you will know exactly what to expect from this installment. It is clear that the studio refused to learn from previous criticism. Every Marvel movie trope is here: corny one-liners, forgettable villains, predictable stories, etc.

Despite the movie's glaring flaws, *The Marvels* is still enjoyable. The film's visuals are impressive, with creative set design and eye-popping CGI. There are plenty of explosive, colorful action sequences, and the film never has a dull moment with the 1hr 45 minute runtime. The lighthearted tone makes for an easy viewing experience, that is pleasing to fans of all ages.

In conclusion, *The Marvels* is a decent film that offers exactly what fans will expect. The over-the-top humor and action will keep you entertained, but there is little to offer in terms of storytelling and character development. Although it is entertaining, *The Marvels* is far from new and resfreshing. Marvel Studios will need to offer the fans something new to keep their franchise fresh.

Holiday Cheer at the Woodward Museum

Noodward Museum. Guests were able to get a taste of history with 19th century holiday treats, including mince pies, pumpkin preserves, sugar plums, cranberry pies and more. Visitors also had the opportunity to visit their textile exhibit, and tour "The Campbell House" next door. The museum was the home to Ashbel Woodward; a physician, farmer, and historian who dedicated the majority of his life to serve the town of Franklin. The tight-knit community and staff at the Woodward Museum work hard to honor Woodward's contribution to the town. Museum goers are met with a warm welcome, and given the opportunity to both learn more about the history of Franklin, and experience the essence of the holidays in the 19th century. Local historian, Matt Novosad, emphasizes that, "Foods are really an interesting way to connect with the past, [...] you quite literally get to taste what people more or less tasted [...] prior to [the 19th century]. Christmas wasn't really celebrated, so this was kind of a new era, [...] and we get to taste what that started like." The town of Franklin continues to keep their community together, and honor the people who have provided their service to the town. Events like the Holiday Open House at the Woodward Musueum display the level of care the townspeople have towards their peers, as well as their history.






