

Sports Gambling: Opportunity Or Risk


Gambling addiction can harm college students

ack in October of 2021, Connecticut lawmakers legalized online sports betting, and ever since, the numbers have grown tenfold. In December alone, more than 205 million dollars were placed in the state. Revenue has exploded in this gaming sector, reaching an estimated 75% increase annually. While the sports betting world is booming for all demographics, it's no secret that college students are being targeted the most.

The heightened profits in the gambling industry have prompted a surge in advertising efforts. It is speculated that the overall advertising expenditure across all media channels may reach approximately \$3 billion each year. This encompasses various platforms, including social media outlets such as TikTok, where there is a higher likelihood of young adults encountering gambling advertisements.

A study conducted in the United Kingdom revealed that 72% of individuals aged 18 to 24 have been exposed to gambling ads on social media.

Individuals from diverse backgrounds and age groups can be impacted by gambling addiction, but it poses an elevated risk to college students. Those in the college age bracket are particularly prone to engaging in impulsive or risky behaviors due to various developmental factors. This heightened susceptibility makes them more inclined to take substantial risks and face adverse consequences, amplifying the threat of gambling addiction among this demographic. Southern Connecticut State University College recognizes this problem, stating "students often develop gambling problems at about twice the rate of other adults" and "an estimated 4 to 8 percent of college students are classified as problem gamblers."

College campuses are witnessing increased accessibility to sports betting. According to a New York Times inquiry, sports betting firms and universities have effectively transformed college life into a scenario reminiscent of renowned casinos. This transformation involves the incorporation of online gambling platforms into the student experience. Connecticut is not shy when it comes to gambling, as Mohegun Sun and Foxwoods casinos create a landmark for the state. These casinos are owned, respectively, by the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan tribes, and they are

subject to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA), which does not mandate responsible gaming programs for consumers.

Recently, it was reported that a federal judge in New Jersey has rejected a gambler's lawsuit against the Borgata casino in Atlantic City and BetMGM, an online betting platform, both of which are owned by MGM Resorts International, based in Las Vegas. The judge concluded that state law does not mandate casinos to safeguard their patrons from compulsive gambling, leading to the dismissal of the lawsuit.

This is no different in Connecticut, where there are no laws that require a casino to stop a compulsive gambler on a serious losing streak from digging himself a bigger hole.

However, Monique Fontenot, public affairs specialist for the National Indian Gaming Commission, stated in an email that "many tribal-state compacts incorporate protocols to address problem gambling that include involuntary and voluntary exclusions." Foxwoods and Mohegan Sun have implemented voluntary self-exclusion programs, providing individuals who acknowledge having gambling issues with the option to request exclusion from the casino and/or its online gaming platforms. Additionally, the state Department of Consumer Protection oversees a voluntary statewide self-exclusion list, offering a broader initiative for individuals across the state to exclude themselves from gambling activities.

Virtual Learning Is Ruining Education

The change that affected the way of learning

¬ ver since the Covid-19 pandemic, the implementation of distance learning has been solidified in U.S school systems. Now students have the option to take classes in person, online, or a mix of both. This new way of learning has increased the variety of courses students can take and allows teachers to reach a wider range of students. Students are no longer limited to what courses they can take based on their school campus. Despite these benefits, distance learning has also caused more students to become isolated, and less social. Taking classes at home also means that people who take the class will not ever meet their fellow classmates and teachers. This takes away from the connectivity and community aspect of going to school. Although online learning takes away from the social connectivity of the classroom, many students have benefited from this new form of learning.

According to Drexel University, online learning has given students more flexibility, as well as saving students money. Since there is not a fixed classroom schedule, people can complete their coursework when it is convenient for them. making them have more free time and the ability to pursue their career outside of education. Virtual learning also cuts costs on expensive textbooks and the cost of commuting. On top of that, it sharpens students' time management skills. According to Drexel, "Online courses teach students how to manage their time better since the student bears the responsibility of engaging with the course instead of simply showing up to class on an assigned day and time." The ability to manage one's time is an extremely important skill to have as an adult, and

online education serves as a great way to teach children and teens this skill.

Although online education is cost effective and flexible, it is also extremely detrimental to students' mental health. Before and during Covid, a study was conducted at Harvard University, young children's development was being tracked in the Early Learning Study. The researchers shared that, "families reported a rise in temper tantrums, anxiety, and a poor ability to manage emotions, especially among the young elementary-aged children during remote learning." Isolating students has proven to be

extremely harmful to their mental health, especially for younger children during the early stages of development. School is a place where adolescents develop social skills, make friends, and learn to collaborate with others. Humans are social by nature. "Social isolation and lack of communication often lead to several mental health issues, such as heightened stress, anxiety, and negative thoughts (Tamm)." According to The National Library of Medicine, multiple studies on college students' mental health were conducted after they switched to distance learning full time. Over 200 first year and fourth year students participated in the research. According to the study, "The results showed that the prevalence of depressive symptoms and anxiety among students was higher during distance learning, compared with similar results obtained during full-time education."

Staring at a computer screen for multiple hours at a time is unnatural. Learning from a teacher in a classroom encourages a student to actively listen and participate in class. Spending time in a classroom also encourages social interaction and discussion. With distance learning, all of this is taken away. Students are no longer encouraged to participate in class or talk to their peers. Without the classroom, education is desolate, mundane, and anxiety inducing. Not only does the quality of student's mental health suffers, but so does the curriculum itself. According to Brookings. edu, several studies have reported a significant decline in academic performance by college students due to distance learning. "Students in online courses generally get lower grades, are less likely to perform well in follow-on coursework, and are less likely to graduate than similar students taking in-person classes (Cellini).'

Online learning is simply less effective than in person classes, because of the lack of hands-on learning, as well as the overall quality of online coursework. Not every course translates to the online format well, because of the decreased level of dialog between the students and teacher. Hands on courses like public speaking should be taught in a face-to-face environment. The curriculum for

an online course must be carefully refined, so people who take the course are able to learn as well as if they were taking it online.

Distance learning has proven to have more weaknesses than strengths for the education system. Although the increased accessibility and lower costs have allowed people to receive an education without disrupting their everyday lives, but the social isolation, lack of communication, and decline in course quality, have shown that this method of learning is extremely flawed. Distance learning is extremely detrimental to the mental health of students. The benefits of online learning simply do not outweigh the downsides of it. Students should limit the number of online courses they take. Only courses that fit the structure of online learning should be implemented. Classes with hands on learning should be left to the classroom. Schools should also promote study groups and periodic classroom visits for online students as a way to maintain a connection to the school they are a part of. Without the classroom, education is a shell of what it can and should be.

Security Breach At Connecticut College

An information theft that cannot be ignored

connecticut College in New London reported a data security incident and is undertaking a thorough forensic investigation as cybersecurity experts are addressing the breach. The school claimed that an unauthorized party accessed and acquired files on the college's computer systems, including personal information from current students. The college claimed that, so far, they believe none of the stolen information has been misused. They are offering

free credit monitoring services to those whose information was compromised. The college is taking extensive measures to make sure those students won't have to worry about any fraudulent activity involving their personal information. Interim President Les Wong sincerely apologized to the campus community for the incident that occurred and said the college is committed to maintaining the privacy of personal information in its possession and has taken

additional precautions to safeguard it. In addition to the safeguard, the college proposed that all students who have been notified of this security infraction place a fraud alert on their credit file, consider placing a security freeze on their credit file, and obtain a free credit report. A spokesperson for Connecticut College said that because this is an ongoing investigation, they are unable to provide any additional information on the subject matter.

Hit-and-Run Suspect Brought Into Custody

Routine morning for Groton citizens takes a tragic turn

n January 18th, at about 6:10 a.m., emergency services were called to the scene of a pedestrian who was evidently struck by a vehicle, who then fled the scene and drove off, near the intersection of Benham Avenue and Forest Street in Groton.

The pedestrian was immediately transported to the nearest hospital and is expected to make a full recovery. The police department reported that community members had assisted the victim in any way possible to get him the help he needed. Around 2 weeks later,

the police identified the suspect as Russell Ledger, 67, of Groton, who was charged with evading responsibility, causing serious physical injury, tampering with evidence, and failing to use care to avoid a pedestrian.

No description of the vehicle used in the hit-and-run was available, as officers are asking for the public's help to identify the vehicle and are calling for anyone who witnessed the pedestrian get hit or noticed any sort of erratic driving at around that time to call officials. Ledger was held on a \$30,000 court-set bond.

Ingredients:

- Box of Brownie Mix
- Container of cookie dough
- 1 egg
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- ½ cup of water

Cookware:

- 8"X 8" Pan
- Spoon
- Measuring Cup
- Large Bowl

Steps:

1. Preheat oven to 350 Degrees Fahrenheit. While the oven warms up, gather your ingredients and prepare your baking pan

2. **Mix the brownie batter.** Use a sturdy whisk or spatula to blend the wet and dry ingredients together, ensuring a smooth and velvety texture. Take care not to overmix, as this can result in tough brownies.

still raw. If the dough still comes out raw, I let it bake for another 5 or 10 minutes.

6. Enjoy and eat. You can add turned cream to give it a good presentation and an extra flavor to taste. Share it with those you love most.


Bass & Guitar


Totally different from what many people believe

ass and guitar look pretty much identical to some people. They look very much alike, but you would be surprised to know that they are both completely different and unique in their own way. In a band setting, the bassists job it to keep the groove and low end tight throughout the playing. The guitar would take control of the higher end of the mix, creating melodies. Each together produces a well-rounded sound, as each instrument covers a certain area in the sonic space. The guitar is usually less heavy and smaller than a bass. The gauge of the strings is smaller because each open note is pitched

an octave higher than a bass. There are usually six strings on the guitar, which is perfect for all the riffs, melodies, licks, and tricks you can make. The scale length of a guitar can vary, but it sits around 24.75" to 25.5." This is a good difference compared to the average scale length of a bass, which is 34." Bass guitars will likely have fewer strings than a guitar, as the main bit of playing will just be on the lower end of the fretboard. Bass strings will make up the same first four strings of a guitar: E, A, D, and G. Both are awesome instruments to learn, and when played together, they create something special.








Bluff Point State Park


Bob's Marley Promotional Poster.

Mickey Mouse In Public Domain

very year, a new set of creative works enters the public domain and becomes available for the public to creatively use and profit from. When creative material enters the "public domain," it is no longer protected by trademark, copyright, or patent laws. Although a work in the public domain is free to use without permission, it cannot be owned by anyone else. For a work to enter the public domain, the copyright must expire, or the copyright owner must deliberately place their work in the public domain. A creative work can also enter the public domain if the owner fails to follow copyright renewal rules.


The most notable work to enter the public domain this year is Walt Disney's "Steamboat Willie." The 1928 script was the first cartoon to feature Mickey Mouse. After 95 years of copyright protection, anyone in the U.S. has access to creatively reuse this pop culture icon. Although the "Steamboat Willie" version of Mickey Mouse is free to use, the modern version of Mickey is still copyright protected by Disney.

When the original cartoon was first released in November 1928, it was revolutionary. "Steamboat Willie" was one of the first animated films to use synchronized sound, and because of this, it quickly took the world by storm and gained widespread critical acclaim.

Disney has fought to maintain ownership of

this work for many decades, to the extent of even lobbying the U.S. government to change copyright laws. In 1976, copyright laws were changed, allowing owners to retain ownership for the duration of the author's life plus 50 years. In 1998, Disney successfully convinced lawmakers to change the law once again, resulting in copyright owners maintaining protection for the duration of the author's life, plus 70 years.

Despite Disney's extensive efforts to maintain ownership of "Steamboat Willie," it finally entered the public domain in January 2024. Disney recently made an official statement regarding "Steamboat Willie." According to the Associated Press, they said, "We will, of course, continue to protect our rights in the more modern versions of Mickey Mouse and other works that remain subject to copyright."

Losing Ma'Damn Mind over Madame Web

Does the new web heroine live up to the hype?

rist and foremost, it really wasn't that bad.
People were coming out of the woodwork to claim, "Madame Web may not only be the worst movie of the year, but perhaps the decade.
Perhaps the century!" But this hypothetical doesn't take away from the fact that Madame Web was bad, but it wasn't that bad.

We open with a flashback to some year of 1970's, and we see a young Constance Webb, a scientist (?) and her security detail, Ezekiel Sims. I am not a huge comics fan, so take this review with a grain of salt. I do, however, know a little bit about who these characters get their namesakes from, and to me, it seemed like this Ezekiel guy had almost nothing to do with the Ezekiel Sims from the comics, outside of having a loose-fitting suit and walking around with bare feet. Ezekiel, played by Tahar Rahim, has fallen victim to yet another trope the greater Marvel Cinematic Universe is always itching to whip out: he is a bad guy who does bad things because he is a bad guy. He always wants more "power." So he steals a magic spider, shoots a pregnant Constance, and schleps out of the rainforest, no problem. And thus, the movie begins. The main issue I had with the film up to this point was that the dialogue was absolutely horrendous. There are a few cardinal rules in filmmaking, one of which is "show, don't tell." The amount of times Constance turned (almost) to the camera to say something like "We're here looking for a magic spider because the movie needs me to" gave me a double dose of agita coupled with intense whiplash. Ezekiel would look (almost) directly into the camera and say something like, "I'm here to work

as your bodyguard, but I also want a spider so I can be a cool spider-like man, NOT SPIDER-MAN, no. But here is where things turn. Constance gives us a line that equates to "We've been here for months; we'll never find the spider," and then cuts to Ezekiel rifling through her belongings back at camp. Constance walks out of the jungle holding a jar and says, "Ope! I Found the bugger!" and then good old

Zeke straight up shoots her. After this moment, things actually get kind of good. She goes home to her shockingly apartment and lets the dirtiest cat in the world onto the same table she eats on (disgusting). Johnson then gets roped into doing "girl stuff" with a pregnant Mary Parker, played by the ever-delightful Emma Thompson. She has some very funny (sad) bits about her mom getting shot in the rainforest, and it's so effortlessly awkward and genuine. Oh yeah, she has powers now too. She climbed into a car, fell off a bridge, and died for a little bit. Now she can manipulate time. Pretty cool stuff, actually. Compared to the similar Sony property Morbius, the visuals looked kind of cool, and Johan Soderqvist's soundtrack worked well with the nebulous and sinewy scenes of Johnson floating through the web of time. The filmmakers must have read a Wikipedia article in between acts as well, because the show-don't-tell of it all was prominent in how Cassandra began to develop control over her powers.

That is one of the main issues with the first act. The filmmakers didn't trust us as the audience to have the capability to follow their plot. If you can't trust yourself as a filmmaker enough to put the things in your film that will signify to the audience that something is happening and then trust the audience that they will understand the things you are putting in your film well enough to pick up, then your film will be doomed to fail. Madame Web began doing this in the second act, and the movie was much better for it.

Eventually, Sidney Sweeney's Julia Cornwall, Isabela Merced's Any Corazon, and Celeste O'Connor's Mattie Franklin show up and are all tied together within Cassandra's gasp web. The four of them escape the initial baddie interaction. Cassandra needs to go monologue for a bit, so she leaves the young women in the woods somewhere in New Jersey. That would suck super hard, even after the advent of smart cell phones (oh yeah, this movie takes place in 2003), so they dip on out of there and head to a diner. We get treated to this awful thing that movies like to do where girls hear a song and then just stand on a table and dance indiscriminately, off-tempo, and devoid of any discernible dance- movement. Then one of my two favorite moments happens: knowing the exact

time she needs to arrive at the diner to save her young wards, Cassandra flies through the front door in her stolen cab and bodies, dude. Ezekiel jettisons into the cake case and falls, temporarily stunned. Kids to cab to tire squeal, and we're off. She smashes an ambulance through a billboard and catches Sims midair in something that would have looked at home in a Fast and Furious movie. Anyway, the movie ends, and it was fine. I would watch it again if someone else wanted to, but never on my own.

How would I fix it? I think it's pretty simple, actually. One of the biggest issues with the film is with the antagonist, Ezekiel Sims. His motivation is easily boiled down to "I want to be powerful and stay powerful forever." We don't know any of his friends or any of his family. We don't see his business; we barely see his apartment—just one big wall of windows with a desk and a lady on a computer with eight screens. If we already don't know anything about him, then why let us even see him? This movie is basically just a horror flick, with a little bit of superhero stuff sprinkled on top. It's a final destination with a little bit of a nightmare on Elm Street. At the end, when Cassandra is tracing back how this all came to be and sees Ezekiel back there with her mom in the rainforest, could that be a better reveal? Who knows, I'm no screenwriter. But I am sure of one thing: I would watch Dakota Johnson slam a yellow 2003 Crown Vic into a masked villain any day of the week.


